## **Scripture:**

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters." — Colossians 3:23 (NIV)

#### **Devotional:**

Tony Dungy's success as an NFL coach is remarkable—not only because he broke barriers and achieved incredible milestones but because he consistently credited God for his abilities, opportunities, and success. Dungy is a man who has used his platform to glorify God and share his faith with others.

After becoming the first Black head coach to win a Super Bowl, Dungy said:

"It's amazing what God can do when you're not worried about who gets the credit." This powerful statement reflects Tony's belief that his talents and achievements were not about him but about glorifying God. Throughout his career, Tony Dungy demonstrated humility, patience, and perseverance, qualities that he attributes to his relationship with God. He worked hard, but he also trusted God's plan for his life, even when things didn't go according to his own expectations.

The Bible reminds us in Colossians 3:23 that everything we do should be done as if we are doing it for the Lord.
