Course Overview:

The sixth-grade language curriculum consists of literature, Accelerated Reading, language and writing. Literature is composed of several different genres in the first and second quarters. Each story and poem is centralized with various themes requiring the application of numerous literary elements and strategies to refine comprehensive skills. Each sixth grader will read, analyze, and be evaluated on chosen selections in their literature book. In addition, reading and analyzing the novel, Where the Red Fern Grows by Wilson Rawl will take place during the second half of the school year. Accelerated reading (A/R) is a school requirement which greatly refines reading skills and encourages reading enjoyment. Students will also write clear and concise paragraphs in order to enhance their abilities for written communication and critical thinking. They shall also write and type papers that utilize narrative, persuasive, descriptive and expository types of writing. Last, but not least, students will employ the rules

of grammar instruction via their Abeka Writing & Grammar workbook which is a necessary component for reading and writing success. Students will consistently read, write and be assessed on a regular basis.

Participation and Assignments

Students are expected to compose an interactive student notebook which shall assist them with daily writing and literary assignments. They are expected to participate in class discussions. Students are responsible for communicating with the teacher about any concerns they have regarding assignments. Students are expected to complete homework and reading assignments on time and to **the best of their ability**.

Plagiarism

Plagiarism is a serious offense and will be treated with an office visit, a phone call home, and a grade deduction of at least 20% of the final grade on the specified assignment.

Accelerated Reading

Students are responsible for obtaining accelerated reading books from the library in a timely manner in order to satisfy the quarterly deadline which is on display in 8B. In addition, students are also responsible for monitoring their A/R progress and taking their A/R tests in a timely manner. Students should bring their A/R book to all classes at all times as well as reading at home. The sixth grade goal for each quarter is 10.0 points.

Course Overview

The rest of the year will be focused on applying their knowledge of maps to United States history from the founding of the United States to the present. Student Responsibilities

Assignments will be given almost every day, and students will be held responsible to complete the assignments thoroughly and on time. Students will do a significant amount of map work during the course, especially when studying geography. Students will also be held responsible to prepare for quizzes and tests, as well as speak with me if they have questions concerning the material. Work ethic is imperative for this class, and will also affect students' grades. If students work hard, study maps, thoroughly complete homework and utilize study guides, it should not be difficult to get a good grade. If it is sensed that a student is putting forth adequate effort, and their grade is not at a satisfactory level, the student is responsible to see me for additional instruction and guidance through the material.

Course Overview and Objectives

Students will be using *Realidades* textbook and practice workbook. In addition to these tools, our class will be using curriculum based reinforcement activities, overhead transparencies, audio CDs, videos/DVDs, puzzles, and other games to aid students in building a foundation for Spanish 1.

Students will develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills in Spanish. Students will learn and utilize an extensive vocabulary in the following themes: *Friendship, School, Sports and Leisure Activities, and Food.* Students will also be introduced to grammatical rules and concepts needed for writing, reading comprehension, and verbal communication.

Student Responsibilities

- Every day students should bring the appropriate materials to class.
- We will be using the following materials this year: Realidades textbook & practice workbook, notebook, dictionary, folder and pens. Students should take care of their books and keep them from vandalism.
- Students are to follow the **Classroom Expectations** and school rules at all time.

Grading

- 15% Classwork/Participation Students will be required to take part in discussions and group activities. Written assignments will also be given during class to reinforce and review material covered.
- 15% Homework Students are expected to complete all homework assignments and turn them in the next day. A missing assignment will result in a '0'.
- 25% Quizzes Students will be given quizzes throughout the unit to assess their current understanding of the recently learned material.
- 45% Tests/Projects Students will be given projects and tests to assess their knowledge and use of Spanish.

Computers

Library

Students may check out books for two weeks, after which time the students have the option of renewing the book one time. Mrs. Courtney is the librarian. The library is open each morning at 8:25 and each day after school at 3:00 for students to take AR tests.

Physical Education

Physical education is held twice a week for 53 minutes. Mr. Ritzema is the boys' teacher and Mrs. Bolkema is the girls' instructor. Students must have P.E. uniforms, deodorant and athletic shoes.

Chapel

Chapel is held on Friday mornings from 8:50-9:35 am at Fellowship Hall or in the Extended Day room. Parents are welcome to attend.

In-Between Class Tardy Policy

Jr. High students have the added responsibility of being in their classrooms and seated before the passing period bell rings. If students are late a tardy slip will be issued. The following consequences will be issued for in-between tardies:

4 tardies = cannot participate in the next hot lunch.
