Prayer Corner: ע : A Week That Changed Everything



Palm Sunday: From Praise to the Cross

Scripture Readings:

"Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel!"

— John 12:13 (NKJV)

"Then Jesus went into the temple of God and drove out all those who bought and sold in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves."

— Matthew 21:12 (NKJV)

"For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil..."

— 1 Timothy 6:10 (NKJV)

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of what Christians call Holy Week—the final days of Jesus' earthly ministry. On this lay, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding on a donkey, fulfilling the prophecy of Zechariah 9:9. The people welcomed Him with joy and worship:

"Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" (John 12:13)

They laid down palm branches and cloaks, declaring Him King. But just five days later, the same crowd shouted something far different:

"Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" (Luke 23:21)

What happened in that one week?

A Modern Lens: The Chosen

If you've seen The Chosen, a powerful series that brings the Gospels to life, you may recall how Jesus' ministry challenged both religious leaders and social norms. Though I hadn't followed the series before watching the latest installment in theaters, I was moved by the depiction of Jesus' righteous anger in the temple.

He overturned the tables because people were blocking access to God. The religious leaders had turned a house of prayer into a place of profit. Jesus wasn't angry because of money itself—but because people were being led astray and excluded from encountering God.

**** The Risk of Truth**

Jesus risked His popularity and ultimately His life to stand for truth. He knew His actions would provoke the powerful, but He cared more about people's souls than their applause.

"Zeal for Your house has eaten Me up." (John 2:17)

As I reflected on this, I asked myself: Would I do the same? Would I be willing to confront lies or injustice—especially when it affects people's ability to know Christ?

It's not just about flipping tables. It's about having a heart that grieves when people are led away from the truth and being bold enough to act in love, even when it costs us something.

A Reflection Questions:

- 1. What areas of your life might be "blocking access" to God for yourself or others?
- 2. Are you more concerned with being accepted by people—or standing for truth in love?
- 3. Are there moments when you've stayed silent instead of defending the truth of Christ?

Prayer:

Jesus,

Thank You for being the kind of Savior who stands for truth, even when the world turns against You. Help me to love You more than I love the approval of others. Give me a heart that grieves over injustice and false teaching. And give me courage to stand for what is right, even when it's hard.

Amen.

K Closing Thought:

Palm Sunday reminds us that worship without understanding can turn into rejection, but true faith remains even when truth is hard. Let's be people who celebrate Jesus not just with palm branches and songs—but with lives that reflect His truth, love, and courage.
