Prayer Corner "From Panic to Peace: Insulating, Not Isolating"



Remember the Y2K scare? When the clocks were about to strike midnight on January 1, 2000, and some thought the world would implode? I worked in IT back then, and trust me, there was a ton of preparation. But over 20 years later, here we are—thank God, literally! It's not that we didn't need to prepare for what was coming, but the panic? Completely unnecessary! We learned, we adapted, and we moved on. Sound familiar? It's like what we faced during the pandemic. So many lives lost, so many lessons learned. But even in the middle of chaos, God was with us, leading us through. And here we are again—strikes, hurricanes, devastation all around. The temptation to panic is real, but let's take a deep breath and remember one important truth: none of this took God by surprise.

Scrambling for a solution; He is the solution. All we need to do is ask Him to step in and lead the way.

Isaiah 43:19 reminds us, "Look! I'm doing a new thing; now it sprouts up; don't you recognize it? I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness."
